What to Bring on a Tour

A new year is upon us and by the count of Model A's on our first tour it will be a great year. In preparation of happy tours it is necessary that we consider the possibility of break downs. Yes, we have had many road side seminars. As a car owner, either new or old, we must consider the need for parts and tools when the time arises. The list that follows is composed of items needed in the past. The list may seem long, but in reality all items can be easily stored in the car. Do not use a tool box(s). Many items are small, and weigh almost nothing. So for example I use cotton socks, cotton gloves (for open and closed end tools, spark plug wrench etc.) and Zip Lock baggies. The most important thing is a list of these items and were they stored. Make a list and keep it in your side door pocket. On a tour, time is important. Test every spare part by actually running it on your Model A before placing the part among your spares.

The list is divided into two groups: tools and supplies that should be carried all the time and stored under your seat. The other list is for those long tours.

- Membership in the Automobile Club AAA (For 200 mile tow service suggested)
- Toilet Paper (you just never know)
- Jack and Handle
- Tire Pump
- Ball Peen Hammer
- Socket wrench set 5/16 7/8 sockets
- Adjustable wrench, small and large
- Box wrench, 1/2 x 9/16 (battery)
- Screw drivers
- Pliers (regular or Channel Locks)
- Wire cutter / Stripper
- Ignition tools feeler gauge, file, etc.
- Flashlight w/batteries (with extras is good)
- Inner tube patch kit or inner tube
- Electrical tester
- Distributor shaft wrench
- Tire Irons
- Knife / Scissors
- Ford spark plug wrench
- Crank Handle

ATTENDEES:

Twenty two members and one guest joined the Zoom get-together.

SUNSHINE REPORT:

Tim Schmidt reported that former long-time member, Charlene Sanders is in the Mercy West Hospital undergoing testing. Cliff Gilb reported that he recently fell and injured his back. He will be seeing an Orthopedic surgeon soon.

ONGOING MEETINGS:

Jarrod Williams, Director, opened discussion regarding when the club will resume in-person meetings.

Members felt that State guidelines should be followed regarding gatherings.

Never Leave Home Without Them


Gloves were considered an important article of coordinated apparel for a lady of the Model A era. Gloves were bought, made, and worn for most activities outside the home. Fashion enthusiasts have looked for the three gores stitched or appliqued across the back of the hand to determine the originality of a pair of gloves. The MAFCA Fashion Guidelines, 2015 edition, section 3C-1 page 27 documents the characteristics of original women's gloves. The gores were thought to be present in daytime, afternoon, evening, and even formal gloves, 1928 through 1931.

The MAFCA Era Fashion Committee was presented with documentation; Style Source catalog dated 1930 with pictures and description of late afternoon and evening gloves that did not have the stitched gores. The second pair of gloves from the bottom of the page do not have the gores across the back of the hand. There are

three stripes close to the cuff line of the glove.




Additional research and review found a second source of documentation, Women's Home **Companion October** 1931, showing late afternoon gloves without gores.

Following the Era Fashion Committee's policy for documentation review and acceptance as objective evidence, the Era Fashion Committee, April 2020, approved changes to the Fashion Guidelines, 2015 edition to include a sentence referencing the possibility that gloves without gores may be worn with a late 1930-1931 late afternoon and evening ensemble. The approved additions to the Fashion Guidelines 2015 edition will appear in a Fashion Addendum to be published by early 2021. The Era Fashion Committee strongly recommends all fashion entrants in MAFCA Fashion Judging present documentation to support using gloves without gores as Coordinated Apparel in the Judging Room.

Rear Spring Cross Piece

The rear spring on a Model A Ford is a 7-leaf for roadsters, an 8-leaf for coups and Tudors, and a 10-leaf for sedans and pick-ups The rear spring is mounted to the frame with two U-bolts. The U-bolts are the same size for all Model A cars. In order to accommodate the Bratton's refer to it as a "rear spring center bottom plate" different thickness of the rear spring the cross piece at the bottom of the U-bolt comes in two different thickness sizes.

A 1x1\8" thick cross piece accommodates the 7-leaf and 8-leaf springs. A 5\8" thick cross piece accommodates the 10-leaf springs. It is important that the correct cross piece be used with a given spring. Two are required for each spring installation.

If a 7-leaf or 8-leaf spring is installed using a 5\8" cross piece it will not allow the rear axle assembly to be properly secured to the frame of the car because the nuts will have bottomed out on the threads of the U-bolts before the spring is secured to the frame, which will create an unsafe condition. If a 10-leaf spring were to be mounted using the 1x1\8" cross piece, I don't think you could get the nuts on the U-bolts all the way.

Both size cross pieces are carried by most suppliers. Snyder's refers to it as a "rear spring clip bar". (part numbers A-5708-A and A-5708-B).

(part numbers 7510 and 7520).



The rear spring mounting cross piece comes in two thickness sizes, make sure you have the correct one for the spring you are mounting. Two are required for each spring.
