Tech Tips - Ignition issues

Quick Check: Ignition (Primary)

With ignition on, turn the engine over and observe the ammeter. If the needle jiggles the primary side of the electrical system is working. This includes: ignition switch, pop-out cable, points, condenser, primary side of coil, and the hidden wire in the distributor connecting the upper plate to the lower plate. (Paraphrased from Tom Endy's article "Model A Ford Ignition Diagnostics")

Note: For early Model A's up until November 1929 the ammeter was not wired into the primary ignition circuit.

To convert:

Disconnect the battery. Open the terminal box on the firewall. Locate the black wire leading from the coil to the terminal on the passenger side, move this wire to the terminal on the driver side. The Ammeter Needle will now jiggle to help with diagnostics.

Quick Check: Ignition (Secondary)

To check the secondary side of the electrical system, remove one brass spark plug connector from the distributor and position it approximately a ¼ of an inch above its terminal on the distributor. Using the key turn the engine over and observe the gap to see if a bright yellowish-blue spark, with a loud snapping sound is being created.

No spark/poor spark; Culprits include:

- Failed condenser
- Lower plate wire broke or shorted
- Point gap closing up
- Pop-out cable to tight and grounding out in distributor

Looking One's Loveliest in 1931

When historians refer to the 1930's, we read about 'the great depression".

Songwriters were asking, "Brother can you spare a dime?" But fashion dictators were trending feminine hairstyles, wider shoulders, narrow hips and evening

wear with a new emphasis on the back. In 1931, dresses were charming, graceful, slenderizing and exuded femininity. The dropped waist was gone. The waistline was worn higher at the natural line and belts were worn tighter. Hemlines were one to two inches longer than the previous year falling at the mid-calf and for the most part were straight although uneven hems were seen on "Sunday Supper", semi-formal and other formal afternoon fashions. Sleeveless dresses had matching jackets or boleros. Dresses with short sleeves were here to stay. Semi-formal dresses had capped sleeves, short elbow length sleeves or a shallow cape attached.

Dresses were seen in black, shades of dark brown, wine, maroon, rose and a variety of dark greens.
Black or navy blue were combined with white,

pastels or bright colors and were important spring and summer colors. Shades of tan and brown were mixed with colors in a print or as an accent. Ornamental bows and flowers of earlier years weren't as common but were seen on semi-formal and formal dresses.
