## 2023 March Clutch Replacement Seminar

You might recall the story about my Model A and the adventure that took my buddy Bob Green and I from Detroit, Michigan to Wakefield, Virginia to find it and bring it back. It's been about a year now since that journey took place and I thought you might enjoy an update on its progress.

First, I'm a believer that all cars should have a name. On our travels home from the commonwealth of Virginia, Bob and I discussed several naming options. I was first thinking about the name, Marcel. The name comes from comedian Jerry Clower and his stories about his best friend, Marcel Ledbetter. Those stories always made me laugh. However, after much thought it was decided that the car should have a girl name. It finally dawned on me that her name could be nothing other than Virginia!

I got busy ordering parts from Model A suppliers. Virginia got a new set of tires, updated distributor, radiator, and water pump, amongst other items. Her gas tank was a mess from setting so long. It had some holes that would need to be taken care of as well as a good boiling out. I removed the tank myself after watching some YouTube videos as well as some instructions from the Model A bible (Les Andrews Model A Ford mechanics handbook) and took it to a radiator shop that club member; Conrad Gerdes suggested. They fixed it up and I was able to get it all back together without too much trouble.

The next thing on the list was the head gasket needed replaced. I borrowed a head puller from Larry Arnold and got to work. After a few weeks of PB Blastering the head bolts, I was able to get the old head off and start the repairs. I discovered that the old head had a hairline crack in it and was not going to be worth fixing. Jarrod Williams hooked me up with a parts supplier and in no time, I had a freshly decked replacement head that was ready to install.

I got the head gasket installed right before it started getting too cold in my garage to do much else. Winter gives you time to set and think about what's next on the list. I knew that the clutch was going to be the next "big thing" that I would have address. At a club meeting, Jarrod suggested a series of Model A workshops where club members could meet up and learn by doing different maintenance and technical fixes. I immediately offered my car as the first guinea pig to work on Virginia's frozen clutch issues. I was also blessed by club members; Brad and Chris Hamlin who offered their heated workshop and host of the club event.

I decided to go with a lightened flywheel and obtained one by driving up to Bluffton, Indiana where I met the nicest people at Antique Engine Rebuilding. I got a tour of their shop and was in awe of all the model A engines that they were working on bringing back to life. I also placed an order at Snyder's to get the rest of the supplies needed to do the work.

The day finally came for the club event at the Hamlin's. Brad and Chris had come over to my house days before and trailered Virginia to their shop so that we could be ready for the work to take place. Brad and Chris have an absolute amazing workshop and log cabin on site. Brad had a lift and fully stocked shop that made the work a lot easier than trying lay on the floor to do the repairs at my house. Club members started showing up and the day's work began when Terry Owens started removing bolts!

I encourage you to check out the video that Jarrod posted on YouTube (<u>https://youtu.be/88ll7dR8bB4</u>) that captures the progression of the work. We enjoyed donuts and as well as an awesome lunch served in the Hamlin's log cabin. Every club member that showed up was involved in the work. The thing you may notice most about the video is the laughter that we shared. It was a great day that ended with Virginia being able to shift gears once again!



During the work, we discovered that the rear leaf spring was broken! I began searching for a new one. However, I quickly learned that there is a nation-wide shortage, and none could be purchased from a Model A parts supplier. Brad once again came to the rescue. He found a used spring on Facebook marketplace from a seller in Columbus, Ohio. I got in touch with the seller and obtained the needed part. A few days after the club workshop, Brad and I finished up the work by installing the "new" leaf spring and installing replacement modern style shocks and adjusting the breaks.

After almost a year of ownership I got to take my first drive! The first stop on my short drive was to get some gas. I couldn't stop smiling and couldn't help but to notice that other people seemed to enjoy looking at Virginia as they had smiles on their faces too. There is just something about Model A's that make people happy.

The next thing on my list is to update Virginia's wiring. I need to add a second taillight and install the turn signals that I got from Jim Rupp as well as adding seat belts for a little bit of safety. Club member, John Grossheim is working on getting Virginia's voice back by working on her ahooga horn! Can't wait to get that back on the car.

You may notice in this update that I have made mention of lots of club members who have helped along with my car's progression. I want to thank all of you Ohio Valley Region Members who have helped and supported me in any way. You may have worked on my car, offered advice, parts, tools or encouragement. Know that without your help I may have given up on this dream and that this club of ours is truly a family. Looking forward to touring and making model A memories with you all.

#### Men's Jewelry During the Model A Era

In her September 2004 Era Fashion website article, Marie Robinette provided an excellent review of men's attire during the years 1928-1931. Little jewelry was worn to accessorize their fashions and chosen carefully so that a gentleman had the correct piece for every occasion. A man's watch would probably be the most prominent jewelry worn, followed by cuff links and studs, rings, belt buckles and pen knives in addition to other items.



Pocket watches remained very popular and were often worn with business suits. A white metal pocket watch and key chain were considered most correct with evening attire. Wrist watches were the new trend of this generation and worn with bracelets of flexible metal or mesh links or leather straps made of calf, ostrich, snake

or crocodile. Even if the man chose to wear a wrist watch, a chain was still worn to protect and keep his keys, penknife or golf pencil handy. This may have been a Waldemar or Dickens chain attached at the vest or with a belt guard and chain that matched his belt buckle and pen knife.

Younger men, while in town and for business, set a new style trend with starched collars and French cuffs. Cuff links were designed quite simply and included semi-precious stones such as carnelian, lapis lazuli, garnet, topaz as well as engraved or engine-turned metals in keeping with the modernistic trend of the Art Deco period. As part of a gentleman's country attire, October 1930 Vanity Fair pictured an animal head crystal belt buckle with matching cuff links. Separable or "Kum-a-part" cuff buttons with a snap closure were considered smart and easy-to-use with soft-cuffed shirts. For evening attire full dress sets were designed with matching cuff links and studs of pearl, onyx and diamond and also included matching waistcoat buttons.

Rings were worn on a man's ring finger or little finger. Styles included birthstones, initial, signet and emblem rings, and were designed using precious, semi-precious and imitation materials which may have included diamond, ruby, sapphire, amethyst, bloodstone, tiger eye, topaz, carnelian and onyx.

During the Depression men's fashion and jewelry were considered a low priority, but the paradox remained...there were still many people of great wealth who dictated much of fashion and the design of jewelry.
