Fuses and Antique Cars

One of my first experiences when beginning to tour in a Model A was learning what can happen when there is a short in the electrical system. My car had been running on the hot side, and the water from the overflow tube was being discharged in front of the generator, a fault in itself. Driving at about 35 mph, the car lost power, and smoke began billowing out from under the dash (also the fuel tank in the A). I pulled over to the side, and my passenger had the door open and was exiting before we rolled to a stop. Funny memories come back: The driver in the Model A behind me turned to his wife and said, "See there, if you talk too much you'll get thrown out!" Anyway, I was fortunate that the battery cable was loose enough to be pulled off, eliminating the continued burning of ignition wiring and saving further damage. The trip home was completed after determining that the short was in the generator, disconnecting power to it, and straight wiring the ignition bypassing the burned out wiring and ammeter.


In the repair and aftermath though, I added a cut-out switch to disconnect the battery and a fuse at the starter where power is fed to the ignition, horn, and lights. This would protect me from a catastrophe in the future. ...well, maybe... (as John Costenbader's article in MARC's Model A News pointed out). He noted that if one were traveling with the generator charging, and for example a short existed in the lighting circuit, and that short caused the fuse at the starter to blow, voltage and current flow from the generator could cause failure of ignition components, leaving you beside the road. In this case, the battery would be disconnected from the circuit, eliminating its ability to store excess power being generated. His article gave suggestions on how to separate and fuse the electrical system for protection from shorts. In the next MARC Model A News, Howard Denker of Omaha Nebraska showed a four fuse block he had installed on his Model A generator. His design was straight-forward but would not fit on the alternators many of us have installed on our tour cars.


Having agreed with the logic of needing to fuse the circuits as presented, I began a search as to where fuse blocks could be bought at a reasonable price. I wanted to use glass fuses because they are cheap, one can see when they are blown, and they seemed more appropriate for the Model A era. Part houses have stopped carrying them, and Radio Shack went out of business. I found a block at Speedway Motors in Lincoln, Nebraska, that would hold seven fuses, and I could cut this block to make both a three-and four-block holder. I also found Harbor Freight to have the best deal on a glass fuse assortment. I then made metal fuse block brackets to either hold the fuses on the generator or on the frame next to the alternator.

The wire to the generator or alternator is placed on the bus bar side of the fuse block with a pigtail wire feeding the generator or alternator through a 30-amp fuse for the alternator or 20-amp fuse for a generator. The rest of the wiring is simple, as the lights are fed through a 20-amp fuse on the block, the horn is fed through a 20-amp fuse, and the brake lights are fed through the last 20-amp fuse. On a Model A, the brake light wire would be removed from the steering column mounted light switch, and its power would now come from the fuse block.

The 30-amp fuse for the starter location would continue to be used, and I strongly recommend the disconnect switch be installed for emergency use, and for use when working on the electrical system.

With fuses installed as described above, a short on your lights circuit, your horn, your brakes, or your generator/alternator may be a problem, but it will not keep you from returning home where you can repair the problem. A side effect benefit is that the blown fuse will diagnose what section of electrical system to work on. The first photo shows the four-fuse block installed on a generator. The following pictures show the kit ready for installation, and a three-fuse block installed with an alternator. Note that the alternator kit is fastened on the frame and is held in place with the hood latch screws. The bracket for the generator fastens under the cutout and is notched to miss the generator terminal.
