### Henry's Way.

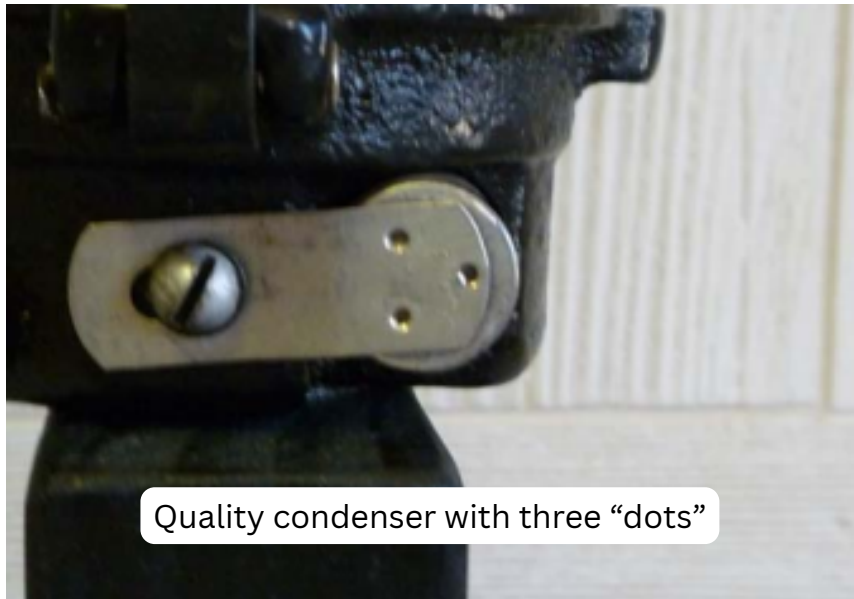
Modern Model A hobbyist are confronted by a number of ways to alter Henry's ignition system design. There are "modern" upper and lower distributor plates, there are high performance coils and there is even an electronic ignition system available. Each is touted to be better than Henry's way because they are modern.

My experience has been that none of these modern modifications out perform Henry's way. In fact many of these modifications come with a number of side affects. And none make the car run any better.

In the early days of the Model A the condenser in the distributor was prone to failure. Since then folklore has come down to us that they are still prone to failure. Whenever a Model A exhibits an ignition fault there is sure to be someone in the crowd who says, "change the condenser".

Electronics has come a long way in the past eighty years and good quality Model A

condensers are available from most suppliers. In all my years of touring I have seen only one condenser failure, but I have seen countless numbers replaced to no avail.

The modern lower plate does not have the wire that connects from the lower plate to the upper plate. Instead it has a slider arrangement. This is not a positive connection and each time the spark handle is moved the slider connection moves and causes sparks and eventually creates a burn trail and in time it will lose the connection.

Henry's original wire was multi-stranded and very flexible. Too often this wire has been replaced by an incorrect type of wire. The correct flexible multi-stranded wire is available from Bratton's Antique Auto. If installed correctly it will serve you well.

High performance coils are touted to provide 40,000 volts from the secondary winding instead of Henry's 20,000 volts. The problem with these is that if you are in an extremely high ambient temperature environment, like out in the desert where it is over 100 degrees, the coil will internally expand and can short out the secondary winding. The problem will be intermittent and when the car cools down the problem will go away until it shorts out completely. I had two such coils fail on two different cars under similar circumstances. Henry's 6-volt coil with a 1.5-ohm primary winding, or the replacement 12-volt coil with a 3-ohm primary winding will provide all the high voltage you need to properly run the car.

If you plan to drive your Model A a lot it is a good idea to be prepared for an unexpected failure of even Henry's way. Carry a spare distributor with you that has the points set correctly and the timing set for your car and then run it for a few miles to be sure it is working correctly. Along with the spare distributor carry a by-pass cable with you that is used to by-pass a possible open or shorted pop-out cable. With both a spare distributor and a by-pass cable you can easily swap out the distributor with the spare and install the bypass cable as well. Within a short time you should be able to have the car running again with this arrangement. It will get you to your destination where you can determine exactly where the fault occurred.

The by pass cable screws into the distributor in place of the pop-out cable. The clip on the end of the cable is attached to the primary terminal of the coil where a red wire is normally attached. The red wire must first be removed before the clip is attached. In order to stop the engine once it is running, the clip has to be removed, as the ignition key has been by-passed.

A spare distributor that has had the timing set for a particular car does not have to be re-timed, as long as the large screw holding the point cam in place is not disturbed.

Henry's way is really the best way to go. His design is simple and it worked well in the old days and will work well for the modern hobbyist. Quality original type ignition parts are available from select suppliers such as Bratton's Antique Auto.

It is also a good idea to not have the pop-out cable bolted to the #8 head bolt. In order to replace the distributor you would have to unbolt the #8 head bolt and it would disturb the torque on the head and possibly warp the head and cause water leakage.

The #8 head bolt is longer than the others to accommodate the pop-out cable clamp. When discarding the clamp replace it with the same thickness of spacer so that the nut does not bottom out on the threads and offer a false torque.

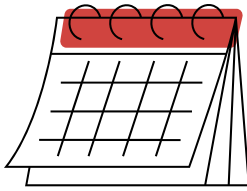

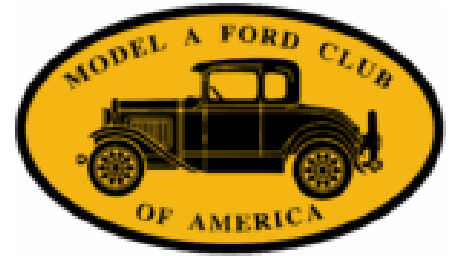

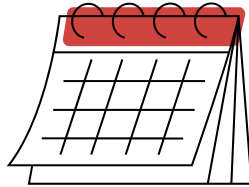
### The MAFCA Story

The club traces its origins to October 1955, when a small group of Model A Ford enthusiasts from the Los Angeles area came together to form a social club for Model A owners in Southern California. Initially named the Model A Restorers Club of Southern California, its activities were focused on the Los Angeles region. On September 23, 1957, the club was officially founded as the Model A Ford Club of America (MAFCA) in Glendale, California, and was incorporated on October 21, 1957.

The launch of its publication, *The Restorer*, in May 1956 helped the club gain nationwide recognition. As the magazine grew in popularity, the club expanded beyond Southern California and took on a national presence. In 1957, it was reorganized and renamed, allowing other Model A clubs to join as affiliated chapters. Since then, MAFCA has chartered over 250 chapters across the United States and internationally.

Today, the MAFCA is the world's largest car club dedicated to a single automobile make. As a nonprofit organization, MAFCA is committed to the restoration and preservation of the Model A Ford. Membership is open to anyone with a genuine interest in these objectives and who meets the qualifications outlined in the club's By-Laws.

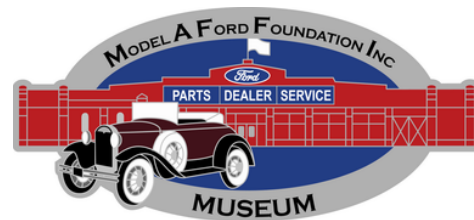

## The MAFFI Story

The Model A Ford Foundation, Inc. (MAFFI) began in December 1986 when Model A Ford Club of America Board Members formed the organization to preserve the history of Model A cars and related artifacts.

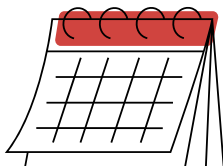
Approved as a California organization in February 1987 and a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) in June 1987, the foundation's activities focus on research, archiving, and operating The Model A Ford Museum at the Gilmore Car Museum in Michigan, which opened in May 2013.

Every year, the third Saturday and Sunday of September, the museum hosts the renowned "Model A Days" event. This is a two day event held at the only museum dedicated to the Model A in the United States. Join in the swap meet, Hall of Fame induction ceremony, car show, tech seminars, and the famous "first-start" of a barn find are just some of the things you can do.

In 2025, the museum proudly finished a massive \$1.2M expansion that doubled the size of the museum and included a "learning" garage area where tech seminars will be held.

Future generations will be able to enjoy the history and fun of the Model A for years to come.

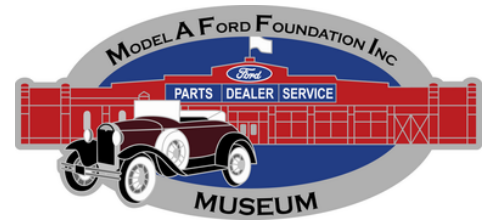

The project began when Ron Jennings donated a 1930 Ford Model A Town Sedan to MAFFI, and the Evergreen Chapter volunteered to restore it. A team of experienced club members undertook a full frame-off restoration. The body was removed from the frame, the original wood structure was replaced with a complete new wood kit, and extensive bodywork was completed before the car received fresh base-coat and clear-coat paint. The engine, transmission, and rear end were fully rebuilt, including new babbitt bearings, re-bored cylinders with new pistons and rings, a performance camshaft, and modern valves with hardened seats. The final assembly included a new top, new glass, and high-quality upholstery, completing the car's polished appearance.

All labor and parts for the restoration were donated by Evergreen Chapter members. After a successful test drive, the finished car was proudly presented to MAFFI at the 2014 MAFCA National Convention in Puyallup, Washington, where the keys were formally handed to MAFFI President Stan Johnson. The car was then transported to the MAFFI Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan, where it remains on display today as a testament to the craftsmanship and dedication of the club members who restored it.

# YOUTH AND SCHOLARSHIP

## MODEL A YOUTH RESTORATION AWARD



### The MAYRA Story

When MAYRA began in 1994, one requirement was that the youth, his or her parents, or grandparents had to be members of MAFCA. The award would be made biennially at an MAFCA National Convention. The Dallas Model A Ford Club stepped up to the plate and donated \$500 for the first award. The Dallas club has continued with its support for every future award.

Over the years, as the program became widely known, more and more youth applied. The program was later endorsed by the Model A Restorers Club (MARC) and youth associated were able to participate. Today, recipients are announced jointly at the MAFCA and MARC summer national conventions. The early awards were cash payments, but when the program became exempt under IRS Section 501 (C) 3, the awards became gift certificates purchased from Model A parts and services vendors. Prior to 2024, awards were made biennially. Awards are made annually.

Every eligible applicant receives an award equal to that of the other applicants. However, the award amount could be less based on an applicant's needs. The award amounts are established by the Board of Directors and have varied over the years based on donations. In recent years, the award amounts ranged from \$1,300 to \$3,000. MAYRA's program is set up so that a recipient can apply for additional awards as long as they are less than age 22 by May 31 of the year when the awards are made.

MAYRA's program relies on local Model A clubs to seek out and identify youth interested in the Model A hobby. It is generally through these contacts that youth become aware of the program. Additionally, the websites and publications of both national Model A Clubs have information on the program and links through Google search and Facebook.

In an effort to expose as many kids as possible to the Model A Ford, both around the country and abroad, in 2022, MAYRA initiated "May is Model A Youth Month." With the support of both national Model A organizations – MARC and MAFCA – we declared May 2022 as the inaugural Model A Youth Month. Each Model A Club is asked to do an event that provides Model A's hands-on contact with children and teens but encourages moms and dads to attend, too.

We have a good and fair relationship with Model A parts and services vendors whose donations are in the form of gift certificates. When a vendor donates, MAYRA makes an equal purchase of gift certificates. A large number of additional gift certificates are purchased from those vendors based on their donation's percentage of all the vendor donations.

We spent some time enjoying conversation, eating bagels and drinking coffee until our planned drivers meeting at 9:00 a.m. As we gathered around the Model A's in the parking lot, Stu handed out goody bags he had prepared for everyone. Excitement was in the air, although I noticed that Tom Blomer was having a bit of trouble with his carburetor. I stretched out the meeting just enough to give him time to get things sorted—a delay that turned out to be a blessing, as it allowed Tom Losekamp, to pull in only a few minutes behind schedule.





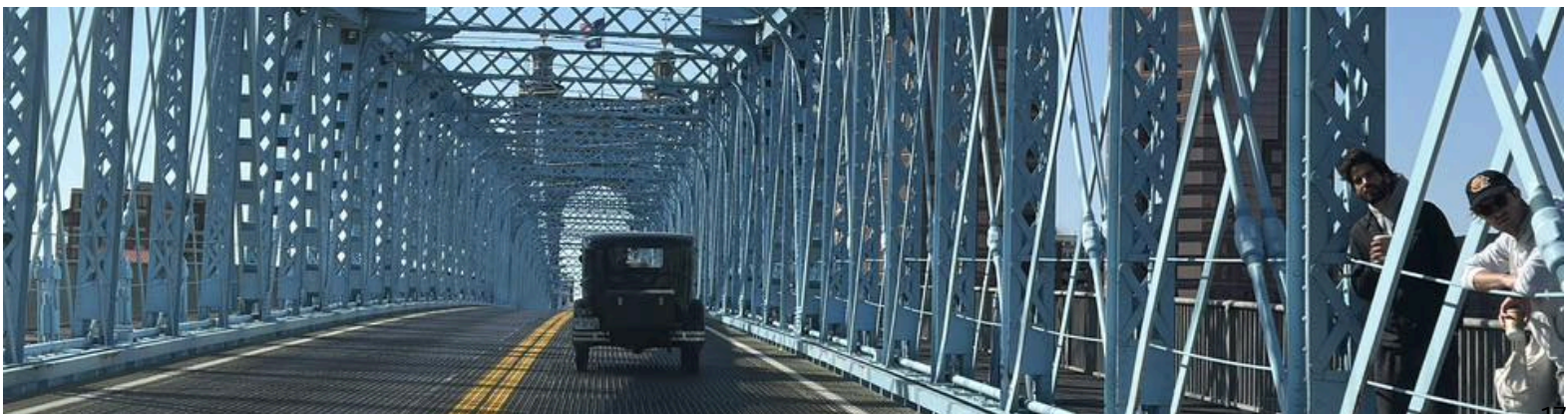
With eleven Model A's and three modern cars, we headed toward our first stop: the Greater Cincinnati Railroad Museum in Covington's Latonia District. City traffic made it a challenge to keep the group together, but our walkie talkies kept communication smooth and ensured no one was left behind.



The museum wasn't open, but we were still able to peer through the fence at the nearly 80 pieces of historic train equipment. It was fascinating to see old locomotives and Pullman cars in varying states of restoration and decay. With no restrooms on site—and knowing we'd need a break soon—we didn't stay long before “mounting up” and heading to nearby, Elsmere, Kentucky.



Just before reaching our next stop, we crossed a set of railroad tracks that nearly caused “Phyllis Pease” to become “Phyllis Pee’s”—after a long wait for a restroom. Thankfully, she made it over the bumpy crossing, giving everyone a laugh when she told her “close call” story.





In Elsmere, we met my friend Charley Bilott for a tour of his father’s personal car collection. Robert Bilott, the attorney whose fight against DuPont inspired the film *Dark Waters* (2019), put together an impressive and unique collection. The garage was filled with plenty of four-door luxury cruisers—Cadillacs, Lincolns, Chryslers—spanning from the 1950s through the 1980s. The Bilott’s were gracious hosts, taking time to chat with everyone and share stories about their prized vehicles. We stayed longer than planned but eventually said our goodbyes and continued on.

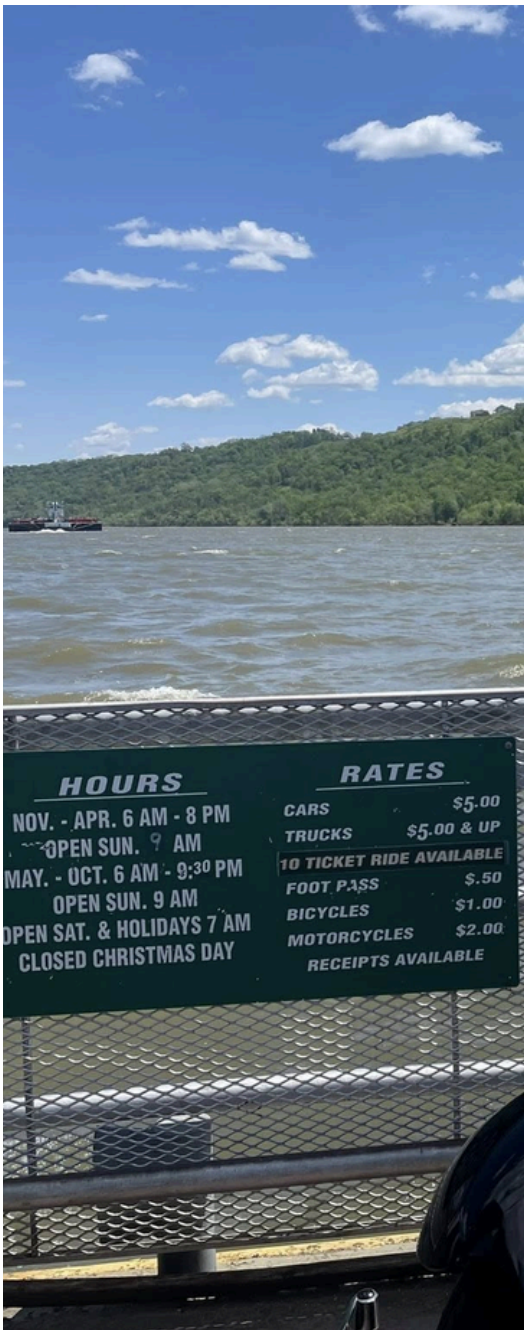

The drive along the river was stunning, with views fit for a painting.

Fortunately, all the Model A's fit onto the ferry, leaving our friends in their modern touring cars behind. We waved goodbye to our modern car friends as they waited for the next boat. The wind added a bit of excitement to the ride as waves gently bounced us across the river.





Back on the Ohio side, we made a brief fuel stop—giving the modern-car drivers time to rejoin us—and then headed to our lunch destination, Jim & Jack’s. Stu set up a table of fantastic door prizes, and the restaurant staff took great care of us. We enjoyed a semi-private space where we could chat comfortably while still soaking in the lively atmosphere from another event in the restaurant.

By the time I made it home, I had logged more than 130 miles. It was a wonderful day, filled with great memories we’ll be looking back on for a long time. 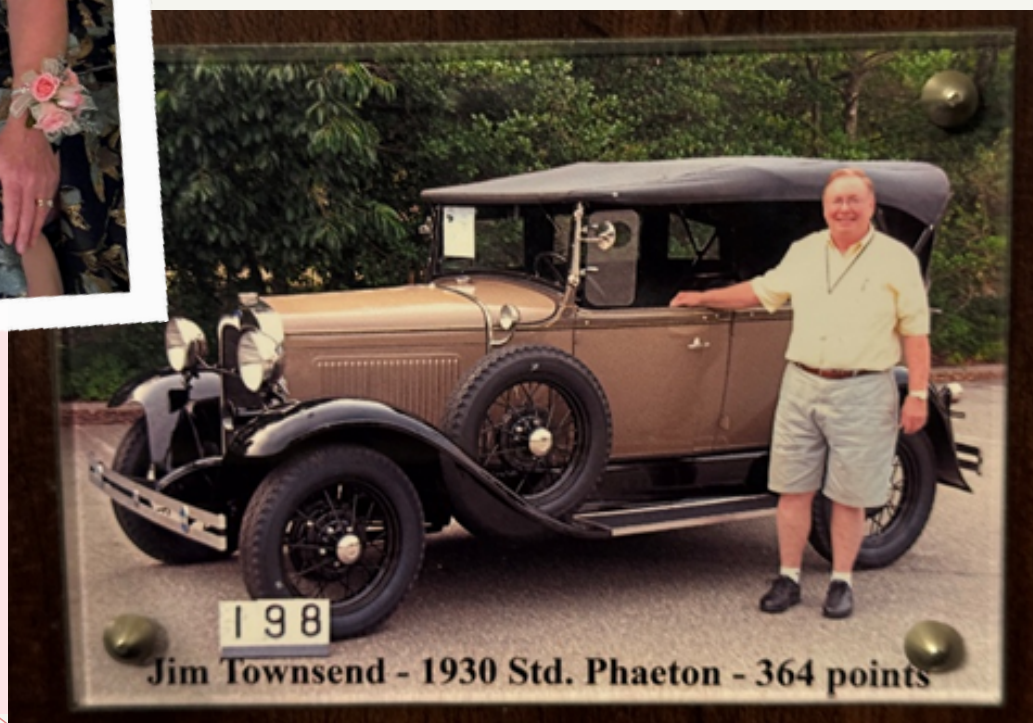






# SHARING THE LOVE

SATURDAY, JUNE 13, 2026

### The Rules:

- You must sign a liability waiver for the property owner
  - Jarrod will have at the meeting location, must be signed and dated before we depart
  - Everyone on the tour must sign one, even if you do not plan to shoot a gun
- Must listen and abide by short range safety talk before we shoot
- Jarrod and Chris Lawson are in charge
- Pistols and rifles only, shooting at metal targets or bring your own paper targets
- We will shoot our fill of pistols and then move up hill to the rifle range
- Rifle range will be 125 yards (375ft) with a 17ft drop
- Guns must be unloaded when brought onto the property
- Only 1-2 people will be shooting at any one time.
- When shooting, only load as much ammo as you are going to fire.

### The Details:

- This is private property. What Chris Lawson, the property owner, says goes.
- Bathroom access will be property owners home
  - there is a little bit of a walk from the field to the main house
- There is only dirt access to the gun range. If weather permits we might be able to drive the Model A's closer to the gun range. If not there will be a short walk.
- We will start with pistol shooting. Once everyone has had their fill of shooting pistols, we will pack up and move everything to the rifle range.

### What to bring:

- Bring your own eye and ear protection (muffs or ear plugs)
- Bring a folding chair
- Sun protection (there is no shade)
- We will have a late lunch on site
  - Hotdogs and or burgers will be grilled out by the property owner.
- John and I will bring chips, but you are welcome to bring other sides to share.
- Bring your own drinks (**NO ALCOHOL at this event. ZERO TOLLERANCE**)

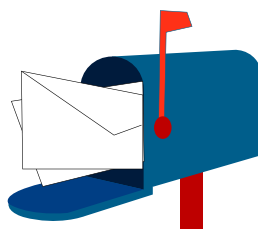
